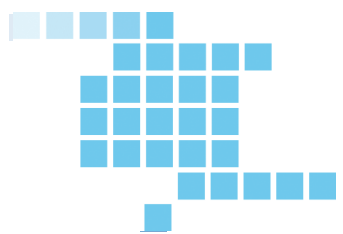

## Funding

---

### New Fund at the National Insurance Institute (NII): The Fund for the Development of Services for Children and Youth

The Fund will support activities which develop services for disadvantaged children and youth at risk or in distress due to special circumstances such as negligence and poverty. The strategic goals of the Fund for the next 3 years are targeted to systematically influence the five following areas:

- Providing a “Second Chance” to youth at risk: Preparation for Matriculation exams, higher education and employment skills acquirement.
- Diminishing and preventing violence among children and youth: System development for children and youth within educational and community frameworks.
- Program Development for victims of sexual assault.
- Program Development for the treatment of detached and drop out youth and teenage girls in distress.
- Promoting parenting education.

*The Fund will operate in cooperation with local, public and governmental entities. The NII has not stated the financial scope of the Fund.*

The association will assist Dr. Cohen, the head of computer studies in the Ministry of Education, to write educational programs for in open code for the 12th and 13th grades.

## The American Jewish Leadership, the Israeli Establishment and the Falashmura

In an article published in Haaretz, American Jewish Leadership blame Israel for delaying Aliya of the Falashmura, Israel leadership on the other hand inquire why Americans do not absorb more black Jews. The American Jewish organizations have contributed to the Aliya of Ethiopian Jews to Israel most significantly by lobbying the American Congress for the budget earmarked for refugees' assistance (50 million dollars for Ethiopian and former USSR refugees). The Jewish American Organization operates the passage camps in Addis Ababa and Gondar in which 20,000 Falashmura are waiting.
